

## Age ratings on subscription streaming services - April 2021

**bbfc** View what's right for you













### **Overview**

#### **Purpose**

This survey was created to ask parents for their views on streaming services operating in the UK and the age ratings they use. The survey asked about subscription services such as Netflix, Amazon Prime Video, Apple TV+ and Disney+, and excluded TV on-demand services like the BBC iPlayer, All4 or ITV Hub. Parents were shown five short clips from films, and were asked 'blind' whether they agreed with two alternative age ratings (one assigned by the BBFC and the other by a European regulator) without being told which regulator had assigned the rating.

BBFC age ratings were compared to the Dutch regulator NICAM's age ratings in this project - but equally the BBFC has also identified differences in ratings from France, Germany, Italy, etc. because every country has their own standards which reflect their own specific national sensitivities.

#### Methodology


All figures, unless otherwise stated, are from YouGov Plc. Total sample size was 4102 adults of which 875 were parents of children aged 18 and under and willing to take this survey. Fieldwork was undertaken between 15th - 16th April 2021. The survey was carried out online. The figures have been weighted and are representative of all GB adults (aged 18+).

# **Key Findings** • More than eight in ten parents (82%) want services accessible in the UK to display age ratings that reflect the UK nations' sensitivities and values • Nine in ten (90%) think that streaming services should display the same age ratings as cinema and **DVD** • Parents are concerned (54%) and angry (21%) at the prospect of streaming services using non-UK ratings



#### **Question 1**


Are you the parent/guardian of children of any of the following ages? (Please select all that apply. If you do not have any children, please select the "Not applicable" option).







Participants were shown a 56 second clip from Blue Valentine (2010).







Participants were shown a 59 second clip from Reinventing Marvin (2017).







Participants were shown a 74 second clip from *To The Bone* (2017)







Participants were shown a 106 second clip from T2 Trainspotting (2017)






Participants shown a 69 second clip from O.J.: Made in America (2016)







Would you be concerned about ratings based on non-UK standards (e.g. US or the Netherlands) being applied on streaming services?








