Quarterly Report of Appeals, Complaints and Advice – EE Strict

The BBFC is the regulator of commercial and internet content delivered via the mobile network of EE for its 'Strict' level of mobile content.

In the interest of transparency, the BBFC publishes all of its adjudications in relation to cases reported to it of purported underblocking or overblocking, along with requests for advice on whether particular content should go behind parental controls or adult filters.

We keep this list updated as and when new cases are reported to us and publish updates every three months.

In all cases, the BBFC conveys its adjudication to (i) the complainant, appellant or person or body seeking advice; and (ii) the mobile network operator EE.

In the following cases, the adjudications represent an assessment of the content according to the terms of the BBFC's EE Strict Classification Framework. Any subsequent changes to content have therefore not been viewed by the BBFC, although we reserve the right to change our adjudication should altered content be brought to our attention subsequently.

All websites that the BBFC would classify 18 or R18, or refuse to classify, would be automatically considered unsuitable for the EE Strict Classification Framework. Further information on the original Quarterly Report adjudications are available on the BBFC's website <u>here</u>.

<u>Issue</u>

A representative of the website contacted the BBFC directly to complain that the site was placed behind adult filters, despite containing no material that in the complainant's opinion would cause access to be restricted to adults only.

Adjudication

We noted that the websites retailed a range of CBD based products. The websites made clear that the products are not to be sold for medicinal purposes and furthermore that they contained less than 0.2% THC. Accordingly, we found no content that we would consider unsuitable for children under 12.

<u>lssue</u>

A representative of the website contacted the BBFC directly to complain that the site was placed behind adult filters, despite containing no material that in the complainant's opinion would cause access to be restricted to adults only.

Adjudication

We noted that the website retailed a range of CBD based products. The website reinforced in text that none of its products contained any psychoactive substances and that all of its products contained less than 0.2% THC. There was also no evidence to suggest that the website was marketing its products as anything other than food supplements. As such, we found no content that we would consider unsuitable for children under 12.

<u>lssue</u>

A mobile network operator contacted the BBFC for advice about the suitability of the website for people under 18.

Adjudication

We noted that the URL led to a Scottish service provider which offered male 'butlers' for hire to, largely, hen parties. The site described the services the butlers provide at a party, which are limited to serving drinks, playing games and modelling for life drawing. There are photographs of the butlers, in which rear nudity is a prominent feature. The site invites customers to seek a price quote, and has a FAQ page which was non-functional at the time of viewing. We did not consider the site suitable for children under 12.

<u>lssue</u>

A representative of the website contacted the BBFC directly to complain that the site was placed behind adult filters, despite containing no material that in the complainant's opinion would cause access to be restricted to adults only.

Adjudication

We noted the URL led to the homepage of a club for participants in recreational non-game shooting sports such as clay pigeon shooting, target shooting and archery. The site informs potential members of the facilities it offers, and lets them know how to get involved, with contact details and FAQs. The site does not trade in firearms, and makes clear to interested parties the necessity of a licence for gun ownership. It placed an emphasis on safety and correct procedure. As such, we found no content that we would consider unsuitable for children under 12.

<u>Issue</u>

A representative of the website contacted the BBFC directly to complain that the site was placed behind adult filters, despite containing no material that in the complainant's opinion would cause access to be restricted to adults only.

Adjudication

We noted that the URL led to a retail site specialising in vaping paraphernalia, and other nicotine-based products such as snus. It offered descriptions of such products and reviews from customers. We did not note any content obviously calculated to appeal to children. The site claims to implement age verification to ensure that customers are over the age of 18, but we were unable to confirm this: it is the retailer's responsibility to utilise effective age verification systems when it comes to supplying customers with age restricted goods or services, and the relevant local Trading Standards service is responsible for the enforcement of this consumer related legislation. We did not consider the site suitable for children under 12.

<u>Issue</u>

The BBFC originally adjudicated on the website in April 2022. Further to the BBFC's original adjudication, the website owner contacted the BBFC to complain that the revised site was placed behind adult filters, despite containing no material that in the complainant's opinion would cause access to be restricted to adults only.

Adjudication

The BBFC provided a further adjudication on a revised version of the website.

As previously, the URL led to a site which featured artwork dedicated to the male form, including with sexual posing. It featured a news section and invited donations. Following links provided by the site we found erotica and pornography, with no intervening age verification. Part B of the Framework lists, as suitable for adults only, 'fetish material', 'genital nudity within a sexualised context' and 'very strong references to sexual behaviour using strong pornographic terms'. We found such material and we did not consider the site suitable for children under 12.
