Passed 'A' with cuts to dialogue, 3.7.68.

It is 19th century India and the rebellious Khasi of Khalibar (Kenneth Williams) discovers that the feared kilt wearing 3rd foot and mouth wear woollen underpants and as a result plans to foment rebellion now that their weakness has been revealed. The Governor, Rough-Diamond, (Sid James) sends off four of the usual crew to save the day but they return and the residency is besieged: all seems lost until the marred and now underpantsless regiment lift their skirts to the natives and they are completely routed.

There were three cuts to allegedly risqué dialogue. The first two seem to be absent but the third "He's just a travelling fakir" is back in. This seems entirely just as the line is completely innocuous, whereas earlier (52.38) we have the line "Fakir off" which clearly does depend on the obvious similarities. I must admit that I would be prepared to pass this 'U' but there is an endless stream of smutty jokes, and a scene at 41 mins where the

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adventurous four fondle the busty 'ladies of the night' that have been provided for them. I'll take the easy way out and pass it 'PG', particularly as we are sensitive about any play on the word "fuck".
